

Oscars 2019

The 91st Academy Awards, presented by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences (AMPAS), honored the best films of 2018. AMPAS presented Academy Awards (commonly referred to as Oscars) in 24 categories. It was the first ceremony in three decades, since the 61st Academy Awards in 1989, to be conducted with no host.
