power"

**Deliberate** 

adjective

**Definition**: done consciously and intentionally.

**Example**: "a deliberate attempt to provoke conflict"

**Synonyms:** intentional, calculated, conscious, done on purpose, intended, planned, meant, considered,

studied, knowing, wilful, wanton

Slacken

verb

**Definition**: reduce or decrease in speed or intensity.

**Example:** "the pace never slackens"

Synonyms: become/get/make slower, slow down,

slow, decelerate

Galvanize

verb

**Definition**: shock or excite (someone) into taking

action.

**Example**: "the urgency of his voice galvanized them into action"

Synonyms: jolt, shock, startle, impel, stir, spur, prod,

urge, motivate

**Poised** 

adjective

**Definition**: having a composed and self-assured

manner.

**Example**: "not every day you saw that poised,

competent kid distressed"

Synonyms: self-possessed, self-assured, composed,

assured, self-controlled, cool-headed, calm,

Dexterity

noun

**Definition**: skill in performing tasks, especially with

the hands.

**Example**: "her dexterity with chopsticks"

Synonyms: deftness, adeptness, adroitness, agility,

nimbleness, handiness, ability,

Incur

verb

**Definition**: become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or

actions.

**Example**: "I will pay any expenses incurred"

*Synonyms:* suffer, sustain, experience, bring upon

oneself, expose oneself to, lay oneself open to;

**Doctrinal** 

adjective

**Definition**: concerned with a doctrine or doctrines.

Example: "doctrinal disputes"

#### **Articulate**

adjective

**Definition**: having or showing the ability to speak

fluently and coherently.

Example: "an articulate account of their experiences"

Synonyms: eloquent, fluent, communicative,

effective, persuasive,

## **Incapacitate**

verb

**Definition**: prevent from functioning in a normal way.

**Example**: "he was incapacitated by a heart attack"

Synonyms: disabled, debilitated, indisposed, unfit

#### Deter

verb

**Definition**: prevent the occurrence of.

**Example**: "strategists think not only about how to deter war, but about how war might occur"

Synonyms: prevent, stop, put a stop to, avert, nip in

the bud, fend off,

#### **Prudent**

adjective

**Definition**: acting with or showing care and thought

for the future.

**Example**: "no prudent money manager would authorize a loan without first knowing its purpose"

Synonyms: wise, well judged, judicious, sagacious,

sage, shrewd,

#### **Faltering**

adjective

**Definition**: losing strength or momentum.

Example: "his faltering career"
